SACRED SINGING OPPORTUNITY


Singing meets mindfulness, meditation and spirituality.

I lead sessions of participatory singing, drawing on traditions such as Taize and Bhakti yoga. The songs are melodically simple, repetitive and are delivered call and response style. We use vowel sounds and simple phrases drawn from different faith traditions, supported by an Indian style harmonium. We tune into the sounds and vibrations of the words: chanting calms and quiets the mind and is accessible to everyone.
